BC Food Protection Association's Communication Strategy & Impact

Over the past year, the BC Food Protection Association (BCFPA) has prioritized clear, timely, and engaging communication with its members. Through a multi-channel approach, we've kept members informed, connected, and up-to-date on the latest industry news, events, and professional development opportunities. These initiatives align with our goal/core mission: "To provide a forum for exchanging information on protecting the food supply". Furthermore, our vision remains clear — "A safe and nutritious food supply". The following outlines the summary of the communication methods used:

- Email Communications: Consistent and Impactful
 Email remains a cornerstone of our outreach. In 2024, we sent targeted event promotions, reminders, and speaker highlights. For example, our email announcing the BCFPA 2024 Summer Webinar Series #1 reached 203 recipients, with a 96% delivery rate and 194 clicks, demonstrating strong engagement.
- Digital Material (Newsletter): Strengthening BCFPA's Brand
 The Grapevine, our official newsletter, continues to be a vital resource for members. It features food safety updates, member achievements (e.g., Student Scholarship Awards), and highlights of upcoming events and educational opportunities. This reinforces our brand and keeps members informed.
- Website Updates: Central Hub for Information
 Our website serves as a comprehensive resource, regularly updated with event calendars, registration links, industry news, policy changes, and archived newsletters. It ensures members have easy access to essential information and resources.
- Social Media Engagement: Expanding BCFPA's Digital Presence
 We actively use LinkedIn, Instagram, Facebook, and X/Twitter to share event
 announcements, food safety news, and best practices. Furthermore, we have collaborated
 with the Canadian Food Innovation Network by using their discussion forums to promote the
 BCFPA's events, which increased engagement with food industry professionals.

BCFPA has actively promoted IAFP and other agencies' announcements — sharing digital content on Food Protection Educational Webinars, Food Safety Trends and Tools, and Student Internships and Employment Opportunities.

After promoting the 2024 Summer Webinar Series #1 on LinkedIn, we gained 6 new followers and achieved 751 organic impressions, 413 members reached, and 31 engagement clicks. In 2024, we've also added 55 new LinkedIn followers.

- Word of Mouth: Building Trust, Expanding Reach, and Amplifying Our Message
 Organic communication through member referrals has been highly effective. Members
 sharing updates with colleagues have boosted event attendance, encouraged new
 memberships, and strengthened our community.
- Virtual and Hybrid (virtual and in-person) Meetings: Bringing Members Together
 We successfully hosted several events, which provided valuable insights on relevant topics
 (e.g., foodborne pathogen control, risk assessment strategies, and food safety regulations).





The BCFPA held a series of seminars, both remotely and in-person, this year that focused on diverse topics related to food safety in North America and was geared to a general audience. Typically, BCFPA's audience comprises industry professionals, members of academia, government, and students. As part of our two-part Summer Webinar Series, our first seminar was held remotely in July 2024 and was entitled "Risk Assessment Strategies in Food Manufacturing Plants: What Can We Do Better to Control Pathogens and Allergens?" and featured Mr. Alberta Mendoza-Galina, a GFSI consultant and auditor. This event had a good turnout of 14 registrants. The second webinar in our Webinar Series featured Mr. Alain Picard, an advisor with the Community Engagement Team at GS1 Canada, who spoke on "Barcodes and Beyond: Understanding Product Identification Through Barcodes and a Review of Health Canada's Labelling and Packaging Regulations". We had 10 registrants for this webinar, By far, our largest turnout was at our Fall Hybrid Speaker's Evening. This event was held remotely and also at the Langara Clubhouse in Vancouver, British Columbia, Canada. The theme was entitled "Importance of Shellfish Food Safety for First Nations' Food Security" and we hosted three speakers: Lorraine McIntyre (Food and Environmental Health Specialist, BC Centre for Disease Control), Jennifer Kopetzky (Research and Development Team Lead, BC Centre for Disease Control) and Timothy Green (Director of Centre for Shellfish Research, Vancouver Island University). Since 2021, we have hosted a hybrid event every year, which typically has the highest turnout, and this year was no different. We had 29 registrants join us both in-person and over Zoom.

The BCFPA-SPDG also had a productive year as they hosted two events: a networking event (February 2024) and a facility tour (November 2024). The student networking event was held at the University of British Columbia and featured industry speakers Parimal Rana, Xin Han, Asha Nair, and Sean Xi, imparting wisdom on R&D, consulting, food safety, and food plant operations. This event was well-attended by 50 undergraduate students in Food Technology. The SPDG also held an informative tour at the Dan On Food and Beverage Innovation Centre at the University of British Columbia (Vancouver, BC, Canada). Here, undergraduate students had the opportunity to network with industry professionals, including Dr. Hossain, who led the tour. The tour offered a rare glimpse into advanced food production equipment and technologies and showcased the future of food production and innovation. This event was well attended by 35 undergraduate Food Science students.


