BEST PRACTICE	CONSIDER	AVOID
Microphone	<u>All</u> speakers and audience members asking questions use microphones to ensure that all individuals can hear the information	Assuming that your voice can be heard by all
Questions	Repeating the question using a microphone	
Inclusive language	Avoiding discriminatory language. Review IAFP Ethical Conduct and IAFP Policy on Meetings Safety and Responsibility	
Presentation slides	Using high contrast colors (e.g., light backgrounds with dark text and bold accent colors).	Using non-contrasting colors (e.g., shades of the same colors)
Presentation content	Make certain the content is relevant	<u>Commercialism</u>
Slide layout	Using simple slide layouts No more than three blocks/sections	More than three blocks/sections More than six lines per block/section Columns More than six bullets Divided words at the end of text

<p>Background</p>	<p>Simple backgrounds, not graphical Solid colors Warm colors Two color gradients One is white, and the other is pastel Pastel colors adjacent on the color wheel</p>	<p>Limit: Graphical or image backgrounds Grey backgrounds Avoid blue</p>
<p>Text</p>	<p>Font sizes: Headings >32 points Subheadings >30 points Text >18-28 points Bold text San-serif fonts, (e.g., Arial or Helvetica, Verdana, Tahoma, Antique Olive, APFont)</p>	<p>Font size less than 18 points Serif fonts (e.g., Time New Roman) Shadowed text Grey texts</p>
<p>Animations</p>	<p>Use: Fly in from left Wipe right Typewriter Appear Laser from right</p>	<p>More complicated animations</p>
<p>Videos</p>	<p>Captioned Video described Transcripts made available</p>
